Sabrina: I am so honored to be introducing Dr. Shirley Edgerton - a beloved treasure of a community member who has been uplighting young Black women- she'll be talking to us this evening about the Civil Rights Bus tour. I'll turn it over to Shirley.

You will hear from her last. I think we have at least 6 of our ambassadors (8-11 years old) and scholars who are present tonight.

And then called on the Scholars, namely Reina, Kennedy, Cashey and Lorie, who spoke.

Shirley: Thank you to everyone for sharing your perspective. I applaud each one of you. At this time does anyone have any questions for our young folks?

Sabrina asked about how they took care of themselves when they were disturbed. Marisa asked about what surprised them- something they heard or their own reaction to something.

Kamaar and "What does Civil Rights mean for you today? What are your hopes and dreams?"
